essay questions additionally a full length practice exam is included at the end of the textbook because the modules in this book are divided into periods that perfectly align to the ap u s history course and exam description it s also easy to pair fabric of a nation with the resources on ap classroom each textbook module can be used with the corresponding ap daily videos and topic questions while the ap exam practice at the end of each period can be supplemented with the personal progress checks from ap classroom
