old buildings form a prominent part of the built environment and we often take it for granted that their contribution is intrinsically positive how has that widely shared belief come about and is its continued general acceptance inevitable certainly ancient structures have long been treated with care and reverence in many societies including classical rome and greece but only in modern europe and america in the last two centuries has this care been elaborated and energised into a forceful dynamic ideology a conservation movement infused with a sense of historical destiny and loss that paradoxically shared many of the characteristics of enlightenment modernity the close inter relationship between conservation and modern civilisation was most dramatically heightened in periods of war or social upheaval beginning with the french revolution and rising to a tragic climax in the 20th century age of totalitarian extremism more recently the troubled relationship of heritage and global commercialism has become dominant miles glendinning s new book authoritatively presents for the first time the entire history of this architectural conservation movement and traces its dramatic fluctuations in ideas and popularity ending by questioning whether its recent international ascendancy can last indefinitely

vivid and in depth case studies show lies in the dynamic and often conflictual processes of social appropriation and interpretation covering a diverse range of themes the book familiarizes the reader with important questions and theories in urban research and heritage studies

diversity of belonging in europe analyzes conflicting notions of identity and belonging in contemporary europe addressing the creation negotiation and re use of diverse spaces and places of belonging the book examines their fascinating complexities in the context of a changing europe taking an innovative interdisciplinary approach the volume examines renegotiations of belonging played out through cultural encounters with difference and change in diverse public spaces and contested places highlighting the interconnections between social change and culture heritage and memory the chapters analyze multilayered public spaces and the negotiations over culture and belonging that are connected to them through analyses of diverse case studies the editors and authors draw out the significance of the participation or exclusion of differing community grassroots and activist groups in such practices and discourses of belonging in relation to the contemporary emergence of identity conflicts and political uses of the past across europe they analyze the ways in which people s sense of belonging is connected to cultural heritage and memory practices undertaken in different public spaces including museums cultural and community centres city monuments and built heritage neglected urban spaces and online fora diversity of belonging in europe provides a valuable contribution to the existing bodies of work on identities migration public space memory and heritage the book will be of interest to scholars and students with an interest in contested belonging public spaces and the role of culture and heritage susannah eckersley is senior lecturer at newcastle university uk an associated research fellow at the leibniz centre for contemporary history zzf in potsdam germany and the project

been to enough biennials skulptur projekte münster only happens every 10 years this its fourth iteration following 1977 1987 and 1997 invites artists from all over the world many of whom are returning to the city and the event to create new site specific works thus michael asher brings back his trailer and parks in sites he first sussed out in 1977 continuing to explore the conflicts between rigid form and mobile space and to document the dramatic transformation of the urban environment over four decades guy ben ner equips bicycles with screens and places them around the city by pedaling participants control the speed and direction of a film of the artist doing the same guillaume bijl mocks up an archaeological site 25 feet square and 18 feet deep whose steep walls imitate layers of soil visitors climb a grassy hill to peer into the pit from a balustrade in the pit a 14 foot shingle roofed spire topped by a weathercock preens this extensive book inspired by and documenting the festival opens on 35 sections between 4 and 16 pages long each designed by the artist and illuminating his or her work in text and images its second half comes in the form of a glossary of more than 100 key concepts linked to the subject of art in public spaces artists art
